The Brick Chapel of 1667

- The Brick Chapel is a *reconstruction*, which means that the building is not an original structure.
- Historians and researchers used archaeological evidence to recreate the Brick Chapel.

Inside the Brick Chapel

- The Brick Chapel is quieter than the outdoors.
- My voice may echo inside the Brick Chapel because the space is large and open.



The Lead Coffins

- I may see three lead coffins under the glass floor in the Brick Chapel.
- The lead coffins once held Colonial Governor Philip Calvert and members of his family.



Safety

- The glass above the lead coffins is fragile, so I will be careful not to step on the glass.

- There is a TV screen with speakers where visitors may watch a video about the discovery of the lead coffins.
- I may sit and watch the video if I want to.
