#### **Paths**

 Most of the paths in the Town Center are paved.

 To get into some of the buildings, I may have to walk over dirt paths.



### Interpreters

- The staff at the Town Center are called *interpreters*.
- Interpreters may tell me about the past and the people who lived here!
- These interpreters may be in costumes and doing jobs that people in the past would have done.
- I may ask them questions if I have any.



### Interpreters

- The *interpreters* may do a *demonstration* for my group.
- If I don't want to participate,
  I can say, "no thank you!"
- A demonstration is where the interpreters show me how things were done in the past!
- While an interpreter is speaking, I can show them respect by paying attention.

• I might be able to participate.

#### **Print House**

- I may learn about a printing press during our tour of the Town Center. A printing press is a machine that was used to print text.
- I may not touch the printing press unless I ask.



# Smith's Ordinary

• I may see a building called Smith's Ordinary during our tour of the Town Center.

Smith's Ordinary shows the type of place people may have

stayed in the 1600s.

• It was like a hotel.

 If I need to rest, I can sit on one of the benches.



# **Brick Chapel**

• I may see the Brick Chapel near Town Center.

• Constructed around 1667, this was the first brick church built

in Maryland.

 Today, I can see the reconstructed Brick Chapel, built using the traditional materials and methods of the time.



#### **Calvert House**

- I may see where Leonard Calvert's House once stood.
- There is no house here now, but this site is where Leonard Calvert, the first Governor of Maryland, once lived.
  - I may see the bricks that show where his fireplace used to be.



## Cordea's Hope

- I may see a building called Cordea's Hope during our tour of the Town Center.
- Cordea's Hope is a storehouse. There are lots of goods on the shelves.
- I may look at the items on the shelves.



#### **Places to Rest**

- There are some picnic tables and benches at the Calvert House area.
- There are also benches inside the Print House and Smith's Ordinary. Both of these places can be quiet.
- If I am thirsty, I can get a drink at the water barrel in Town Center.
