

MAKING YOUR RESERVATION REQUEST

Tours are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis, so it is recommended that tours be scheduled at least four weeks in advance. Our online reservation request form allows you to choose 3 possible dates. Once our reservation request has been made, you will receive an email confirming the details of your tour.

CANCELLATION & CHANGES



Guests will learn of colonial Maryland history throughout the 1600s, comparing and contrasting different groups of people living in Maryland at the time of and after point of contact, religious and political history at Maryland's first capital, the tobacco economy, distinctions between indentured servants and enslaved peoples, and the development of the institution of slavery throughout this period.
